*An afternoon organised in partnership between In Control Scotland and SSSC exploring making good decisions together around risk, followed by an evening of inclusive music celebrating good opportunities to live the life you want.*

*Afternoon session: from 12.30 pm until 4.30 pm*

*Evening music session: from 7.00 pm until 10.00 pm*

Differing attitudes to risk and opportunity still dominate many people's ability to live the life they want, and choose the support that makes sense for them. In this event we want to explore and share some practical tools about how we achieve more confidence in value based approaches to supporting people, demonstrate the breadth of work being done across different areas and promote discussion and sharing of new ideas and activities.

#### **What will the afternoon event involve?**

- The launch of an online risk resource – 'A risk worth taking' - developed by the Scottish Social Services Council(SSSC)
- Sharing a new paper from In Control Scotland – 'Risking a real life – making good decisions together around issues of risk and opportunity'
- Sharing information and generating ideas about 'Stay Up Late Scotland' – a campaign about people getting the right support at the right times for them

There will be short presentations on each of the above topics, followed by a chance to explore different aspects in more depth in interactive workshops. In the workshops, you also get a chance to hear from people's own experiences and from a number of different organisations.

### What will the evening event involve?

An evening of inclusive bands and music between **7.00 pm – 10.00 pm** promoting the aims of 'Stay Up Late Scotland' which is about getting the right support to live the life you want. There will also be a '**pop-up bar**' available for refreshments. **There is a separate flyer telling you more about the evening event.**

We plan to make both sessions as diverse, interactive and accessible as possible to encourage people with lived experience as well as professionals to take part. There will also be some stands and information about related work that people are doing.
